Through the **Heart Safe School** accreditation program, **students received free training in HOPE** (Hands On Practical Experience), a chest compression-only CPR program. The joint effort between the Sudden Arrhythmia Death Syndromes Foundation and the Dr. Gordon B. Snider Cardiovascular Institute Community Heart Watch has accredited 18 schools to date.
