## Fencing Going Up!

This week construction fencing will be up, which impacts traffic patterns throughout the parking lots on the south side of the building. Here are three pointers to help guide patients, visitors and employees through construction zones:

1. Patients and visitors should be strongly encouraged to use the courtesy valet service. See the article on valet services for more details.
2. Employees should drive slow, watch for signs and consider parking in one of the designated employee lots: the new Harmon Avenue Parking Lot, the former student lot on North Ewing Street or the designated parking spaces in the Kroger lot (marked in yellow).
3. All pedestrians should utilize the designated walkways painted in yellow on the pavement (see photo to right).

## Valet Service is a Big Hit!

The new courtesy valet service has been well received by patients and visitors. In fact, there were 26 visitors who utilized the service in the first few days of operation. The service is being provided by Parking Solutions, a professional valet company. Individuals wishing to use

the service should pull up to the valet booth located in the south parking lot and the valet will direct them from there. Individuals will receive a claim ticket to use when picking up their car. To save time, individuals can call ahead to the valet booth at (740) 243-8458 to have their car pulled up and ready for their timely departure.

### **New South Entrance Open**

The new temporary South Entrance is open for business. It is located to the east of the building on North Ewing Street. A covered walkway has been installed that leads from the patient drop-off and valet area to the new entrance (see photo above).

### **Power Shutdowns Coming**

Sunday, Oct. 27 there will be a power shutdown at the Pavilion from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. in order to facilitate the relocation of an underground power line. The main hospital will run on generator power for 15-30 minutes at both 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. when the power is switched. Normal protocols will be followed during these two brief periods, which means no surgeries or C-sections will be conducted.

### **Demolition to Begin**

Construction is scheduled to officially begin the first week of November. Construction will last approximately 15 months, with Project BRIGTH to be completed in early 2015.

### **Blast Cancer**

Patients, survivors and loved ones can help us “brighten” up the temporary quarters of FMC’s Oncology Services from 5 - 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 24, as part of FMC’s Blast Cancer event. The building, located at 214 Harmon Avenue, south of the hospital, will be demolished in 2015 as part of the hospital’s facility expansion project. Participants will be provided paintball guns to blast color onto the building, which will display the word

“cancer.” This symbolic event will include music and free refreshments. Attendees will be able to purchase commemorative Blast Cancer T-shirts with proceeds benefitting the Cancer Care Fund of the Fairfield Medical Center Foundation.

### **Shuttle Service Starting Soon**

Shuttle services will begin in early November for students. Security cameras and lights are being installed at the shuttle lot on South Ewing Street as a safety precaution. Parking Solutions, the valet service, will be running the shuttle service, and the 15-passenger shuttle is being provided by FMC (see photo below).
