FMC HOSTS A REGISTERED CARDIOVASCULAR INVASIVE SPECIALIST COURSE FOR NURSES, CARDIOVASCULAR TECHS, & RADIOLOGY TECHS



LANCASTER, Ohio (September 29, 2008) – Fairfield Medical Center (FMC) was proud to host the Registered Cardiovascular Invasive Specialist (RCIS) course September 20th and 21st that consisted of a two-day class for nurses, cardiovascular technicians, and radiology technicians around the state as well as out of state. Some participants traveled from as far as Colorado and North Carolina to benefit from

the seminar.

Such a course was held in preparation for the Invasive Registry Examination offered by Cardiovascular Credentialing International. The review content emphasized major topics of the exam syllabus to insure adequate understanding of key elements evaluated in the examination. The topics focused on information found on the RCIS registry exam based on its category content and approximate percentage of examination questions.
