Welcome to Graduate Medical Education at Fairfield Medical Center

Fairfield Medical Center is a vibrant 222-bed healthcare organization focused on providing exceptional experiences to everyone it serves. We are in a great location, approximately 30 miles southeast of Columbus and approximately 30 miles northeast of the scenic Hocking Hills area. Drawing on a multiple county market area, the medical center has a diverse patient demographic that is optimal for residency training. Our Graduate Medical Education Resource Center provides a dedicated area for residents and students to train. The center includes lecture and study facilities, sophisticated audio, visual and video conference technology, osteopathic manipulative therapy, and other hands-on learning directed by FMC physician instructors.

FMC offers primary care residency programs in Family and Internal Medicine. Family Medicine and Internal Medicine are currently ACGME accredited, which means that residents graduating from our programs will be eligible for ACGME fellowships and their specialty board certification exams. FMC maintains a strong training affiliation with Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine and participates in the statewide Clinical Divisions that promote collaboration among multiple OUHCOM affiliated residency programs. Originally accredited by the American Osteopathic Association, our Family Medicine Residency Program began in 2010 and our Internal Medicine Residency Program in 2012. Both programs have achieved continued accreditation, as well as continued Osteopathic Recognition under ACGME and maintain a continued commitment to training osteopathic principles and practice.

We encourage those seeking balanced education opportunities in medicine to explore the opportunities at FMC. Our program provides informative community and clinical experiences for first and second year medical students and excellent hands-on clinical and didactic training for third year and fourth year medical students. Our osteopathic-focused residency training programs offer minimal competition for procedural exposure and a breadth of encountered pathology to provide relevant practical training experience. We have an exceptional teaching staff committed to providing not only the best in patient care, but also outstanding learning opportunities in an environment with a comprehensive curriculum. Our faculty and staff offer a wealth of pertinent and up-to-date information during rotations, lectures, OMM and SIM training sessions and in-clinic settings. Guarding Against Stroke

When Jerry Uhl, 73, was diagnosed with afib, he knew he was at an increased risk for stroke. Daily blood thinners helped to keep that fear at bay – until the medication began to drop his red blood cell count dangerously low. Jerry immediately met with his care team at Fairfield Healthcare Professionals Cardiology, who recommended he undergo a new treatment at Fairfield Medical Center called WATCHMAN. The procedure, which involves implanting a device in the area of the heart where nearly all afib-related blood clots form, is minimally invasive with a relatively short and painless recovery. Less than two months after undergoing the WATCHMAN procedure, Jerry is no longer on blood thinners – and is living life without fear of stroke. "I had the procedure on a Thursday, and I was back to work by Monday," Jerry said. "It was as quick and easy as you can expect a surgery to be."

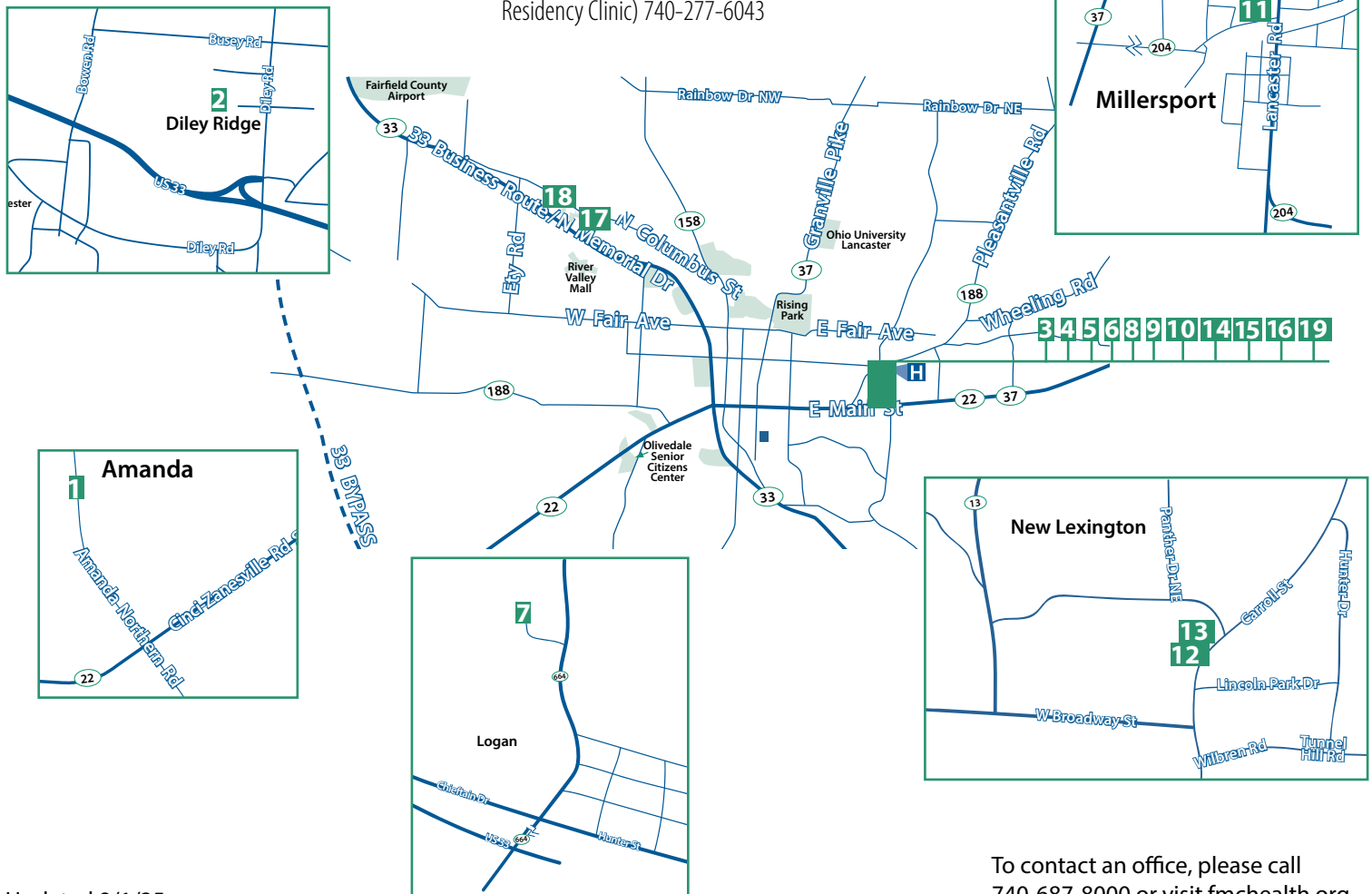

~ Residents have the option to do an elective away rotation during their PGY-2 or PGY-3 year, with Program Director approval, that could count towards an outpatient experience. The 'variable' of outpatient percent in the outpatient experience section will be dependent on the elective chosen.

~ In accordance with our Internal Medicine PTO Policy, last revised 7/26/24:

Paid time off (PTO) may be taken throughout the academic year and is any scheduled, planned or pre-approved PTO requested in advance by each resident, equaling five days of weekly consecutive PTO. These vacation periods may not accumulate from one academic period to another.

Annual vacations must be taken the year of service for which the vacation is granted. No vacation periods may be concurrent and the resident does not have the option of reducing the total time required for residency by relinquishing vacation time.

- All residents receive a total of twenty days of PTO per academic year. Fifteen days are scheduled at the start of an academic year, leaving five days for emergency, illness and/or calamity PTO days.

- All requests for PTO will be approved or denied at the discretion of the Program Director.

- Specialty Rotations are any of the below rotations, completed by the residents at the respective designated site to fulfill the ACGME requirement of 10 months inpatient and 10 months outpatient.
